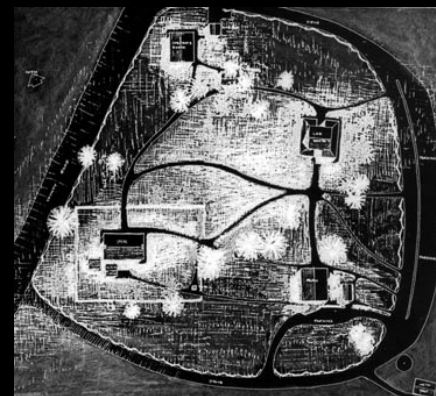
Miss Ima Hogg of Houston, daughter of James

Next, I went to another small sawmill located
near Latiom. Mr. Benny Mueller and his son
Curtis operate it. These timbers were nearly all oak,
but they had far more 1" cedar flooring material
than we will need. It is a full 1" thick and will
suit our project very well. They further agreed to
located cedar logs from which our longest and
largest timbers could be cut. Moreover, their prices
were reasonable and in line with the lumbermen
I had spoken to.
